Dear Selection Committee Members,

I am writing to nominate Sarah Sutherland to the Canadian Open Government Civil Society Network's Multi-Stakeholder Forum as a representative of the Canadian Association of Law Libraries / Association canadienne des bibliothèques de droit (CALL/ACBD), a registered Canadian not-for-profit organization.

CALL/ACBD seeks to have the interests of the users of legal information in Canada, including the legal profession, law schools, judiciary, and general public, represented in the Network's discussions. We have asked Sarah to represent the association, because her experience working at the Canadian Legal Information Institute (CanLII) makes her an excellent addition to the group.

CanLII is a non-profit publisher of legal information, which makes extensive use of government information in the form of court and tribunal decisions and legislation. These are then made available for the public through their website canlii.org. Legal documents, especially court decisions require some special consideration in any discussion of open data, because they are public yet many of them include very private information. They are also government documents that many companies have used to build business generating significant income.

These are important considerations in any public discussion of a national discussion of open data. And Sarah would be an excellent representative to ensure that the interests of the legal community and litigants are considered as part of the larger discussion about open government.

She is actively engaged with the national legal information community, and regularly publishes and speaks in local and national venues.
